Declaration of Intent 2022: Toward a more sustainable future

<u>Our principles and purposes call us to take action to address the climate crisis and redress the</u> <u>social injustice that it causes.</u> UUA has asked congregations to recommit to Green Sanctuary. This document supports and guides our efforts to meet our on-going commitment to the Green Sanctuary Program.

UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST PRINCIPLES

01. Whereas, we recognize that:

Embedded in our Unitarian Universalist principles is *respect for the interdependent web of life*. *Our* religious faith *recognizes* that we are part of the <u>interdependent web of all life</u> and that the *loss* of any part of the *diversity* of life will impact our own *well-being* and the *well-being* of the rest of the interdependent web. This is a recognition that all life on earth is part of our <u>life support system</u> and *changing* one thing *affects* everything.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>**Connect**</u> our religious beliefs with the actions needed to be *good stewards* of the earth and all its inhabitants. <u>**Examine**</u> how our Fellowship's *culture* and the individual *choices* we make either *support* or *diminish* our planet's ability to survive and consequently our own ability to survive. <u>**Determine**</u> what actions we can take in order to be better *stewards* of the planet.

EDUCATION

02. Whereas, we recognize that:

Climate crisis and climate injustice are happening now, and are not something that will happen in the distant future.

Therefore, we pledge to:

Educate ourselves and others about the relationship between a *changing climate* and *climate injustice*. *Take* immediate actions to *lessen* and *reverse* our impact on the climate and resultant <u>climate injustice</u>.

ENERGY

03. Whereas, we recognize that:

Human behavior <u>IS</u> **the main driving force** for the *unprecedented rate and severity of* climate change. That climate crisis and climate injustice are an *immediate* threat to life on our very small planet *and while one individual may not feel the situation is a crisis, more and more individuals are already impacted, some to a devastating level, and this is only 2022.*

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Reduce</u> our use of *non-renewable* fossil fuels and <u>**limit**</u> other activities that are contributing to a changing climate. <u>**Invest**</u> in *energy efficiency* and <u>**utilize**</u> *alternative energy sources* as a means of reducing *greenhouse gases in our atmosphere*. <u>**Commit**</u> to *reversing* our present energy use *choices* and other *behaviors* which negatively *impact* life on our planet. <u>**Work**</u> to make our Fellowship's <u>energy use</u> carbon *neutral* or *negative*.

PEOPLE

04. Whereas, we recognize that:

That *climate crisis* is *inextricably intertwined* with *climate justice* and the *welfare* of humans and our fellow passengers on this planet. Many millions of people are being displaced by the climate crisis and are being

designated as *climate refugees*. Furthermore, social injustice *conditions* bolster the actions *producing* climate crisis.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Seek</u> ways to redress the damage that our way of life has caused to other people and nations. <u>Demand</u> that our government accepts climate *refugees* as both a *moral* and an International *legal right*. <u>Work</u> to *reduce* social injustice and promote social justice in its own right as well as for relationship to climate justice specifically.

05. Whereas, we recognize that:

Our *children* for many generations to come have the *right to a stable and healthy planet*. (*We believe all life forms share this right*.)

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Support</u> all who are demanding climate justice for a sustainable future and <u>take</u> responsibility for our own contribution to the climate crisis through *appropriate* actions.

06. Whereas, we recognize that:

Indigenous peoples have long *been protectors* of the land, water and other natural resources and are now under attack by *special interests*.

Therefore, we pledge to:

Give support and *act* in *solidarity* with the *indigenous peoples* of the earth to protect *all* land, water, and life. Do so at local, national, and global scales.

07. Whereas, we recognize that:

Our own *happiness and well-being* is tied inextricably to the *happiness* of **everyone else on this planet** and **all life**, and that with our own freedom, 'pursuit of happiness', comes responsibility in our choices.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Support</u> the struggle for freedom and happiness of **all peoples** across the world. This includes education, food security, housing, safety, and much more.

08. Whereas, we recognize that:

Our religious faith values <u>the inherent worth and dignity of all individuals</u> and that we have an *obligation* to support others in their quest for a *healthy* and *whole* life. Climate crisis is impacting **peoples around the world** due to *rising* sea levels, *an increase* in the number and severity of *unpredictable* weather events, and much more. <u>Poverty</u> is the main cause of suffering *in* much of the world and the <u>climate crisis</u> is contributing to this and *vice versa*.

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

Educate ourselves on how the *climate crisis* is impacting people around the world. **Promote** an *understanding* of how our actions affect others, *near and far*, and **examine** how we can better support *sustainable* and *dignified* livelihoods of people *everywhere* by choices that we make. **Support** actions to *reduce* poverty.

CONNECTION WITH NATURE

09. Whereas, we recognize that:

An **appreciation of nature** in all its myriad forms and beauty is the *cornerstone* for preserving nature and this begins with ourselves and our children.

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

Engage ourselves and others in activities that *connect* us to nature and *help preserve* our natural resources. **Support** educational programs which help children *connect with, appreciate, and value* the natural world.

<u>10.</u> Whereas, we recognize that:

One of the main causes of climate crisis is that we have **distanced ourselves from the natural world**, and this *disconnection* contributes to our inability to value and protect nature. **Nature-deficit disorder**, while not a formal diagnosis, *describes* the psychological, physical and cognitive costs of human *alienation from nature* especially in children's vulnerable developing years.

Therefore, we pledge to:

Engage our members in *experiential* opportunities to *connect* with nature through programs, outings, etc. **Participate**, **support**, and **encourage** programs that provide *experiences* for children to *connect* with nature and *appreciate* why we need to *protect* the earth.

FINANCE & CONSUMERISM

<u>11. Whereas, we recognize that:</u>

Our **consumer-driven culture** *contributes* to the climate crisis and *produces* little in the way of *lasting* happiness or satisfaction.

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

<u>**Promote**</u> alternative avenues for human *expression and fulfillment*, including meditation, music, dance, art, walks, gardening, and other activities that provide enjoyment and enlightenment while *limiting* our impacts on the earth. <u>**Reduce**</u> our *dependence* on consumer spending: <u>**Reduce**</u>, <u>**reuse**</u>, <u>**re-purpose**</u>, <u>**recycle**</u>, and <u>**reject**</u> (plastic bags, unnecessary packaging, etc.).

<u>12.</u> Whereas, we recognize that:

Our investments may *well* be contributing to the climate crisis and climate injustice.

Therefore, we pledge to:

Divest from any investments including credit cards that continue to support human activities which *negatively* impact life on our planet. **Examine** and **divest** from any investments that we have that are *contributing* directly or indirectly to our climate crisis (including but not limited to operations that displace or dispossess Indigenous people for purposes of carbon storage or biomass production). **Provide** *opportunities* to our members and community to *understand* how our investing or use of credit cards may be *contributing* to the climate crisis and injustice.

<u>13. Where as we recognize:</u>

We have a right to clean water, air, and a chemical-free planet.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>*Make*</u> informed choices in the food and products *we buy and* use. <u>*Support*</u> legislation that *protects* the environment.

FOOD

14. Whereas, we recognize that:

Sustainable food production benefits our *health*, the *health of farmworkers*, and the *health of our planet*. Our **food choices** *impact* our health and the health of the planet. A <u>plant-based diet</u> can be healthier for us as *individuals and for the planet as a whole*.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Support</u> the growth of sustainable food production through education, *choice of foods we purchase*, *prepare*, *and eat at home and elsewhere*. <u>**Reduce**</u> *our dependence on unsustainable* animal products. <u>Support</u> *local*, *organic*, *fair-trade*, *non-GMO* and *sustainable* **food providers** whenever possible.

<u>15. Whereas, we recognize that:</u>

Food handling (retail, restaurants, packaging, and consumers) *consumes* nearly half of the *energy* in our food systems. <u>*Where we buy our food, how it is packaged*</u>, all *contribute* to the amount of energy used to provide us with food.

Therefore, we pledge to:,

Examine where our food comes from and the energy embedded in handling before it gets to us. **Strategize** ways to *reduce* energy consumption when it comes to our food choices.

16. Whereas, we recognize that:,

Food efficiency is *determined* by the amount of energy, land, or water, and resulting emissions of green house gases associated with the *production* of food. Some foods require *more* resources than other. **Plant based foods** often require *less* resources than animal-based products. Our *choices* in the food we purchase can *determine* the impacts of our eating habits.

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

Educate ourselves and others in regard to our *food choices* and their *impacts* on resource consumption. *Make* changes in our *food choices* to *reduce* the impacts of our food choices while maintaining a *healthy* diet. **Explore** *multiple resources to gain this education*.

17. Whereas, we recognize that:,

As much as **40 percent** of the *energy loss* in a **food system** is due to food *not eaten*. Other *losses of energy* are a result of *inefficient* storage and transportation over long distances.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Reduce</u> food waste, *invest in and wisely use* food storage equipment, and <u>**buy**</u> locally produced food from farmer's markets. <u>**Increase**</u> our efforts to *return* food residues to the earth by *composting* to grow more food to *reduce* **methane** or **pollution** produced by landfills and incinerators.

ACTION & COLLABORATION

18. Whereas, we recognize that:

We have the *ethical* imperative to take *action* in the *present* to both *address* causes of climate change **and** *lessen* the impacts of climate change, and that this is our *own* responsibility and not just the responsibility of the government.

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

Take immediate action collectively and individually to *address* and *redress the climate* crisis.

<u>19.</u> *Whereas, we recognize that*: Our **individual and collective actions can make a difference** to the future welfare of our planet. (*They always have and always will.*)

<u>Therefore, we pledge to:</u>

Encourage others to make personal *changes* in their lives in order to address all aspects of climate change and injustice. Collectively, **join together** to *implement* changes in the way we do business whether this is government, private, or non-governmental institutions including non-profits.

20. Whereas, we recognize that:

Progress on climate change necessitates that we **work hand-in-hand with other religious and non-profit institutions** to bring about *change*.

Therefore, we pledge to:

<u>Network</u> with other organizations that have similar goals so we can *combine and enhance* our efforts in *promoting <u>sustainable growth</u>*. <u>Work</u> with other religious faiths and organizations to bring about <u>climate</u> <u>justice</u>.
